Almudevar, Manuel, Waterloo, Ont.; University of Zaragoza (Spain), 1950; psychiatry; FRCPC; former chief, Department of Psychiatry, Cornwall General Hospital; consultant, Hotel Dieu Hospital; lecturer, University of Ottawa. Died Oct. 2, 2003, aged 76.

Bateman, William E., Midhurst, Ont.; University of Toronto, 1943; obstetrics/gynecology; FACOG, FRCSC; former senior attending staff, Women's College Hospital; teaching staff, University of Toronto. Died Sept. 27, 2003, aged 82; survived by his wife, Nell, and children, Dr. William and Ellen.

Beswick, John A., Scarborough, Ont.; University of Toronto, 1950; ophthalmology; FRCSC; RCE, WW II and Korean War; former chief, ophthalmology, Canadian Forces Hospital, National Defence Medical Centre and Scarborough Centenary Hospital; staff, Sunnybrook Medical Centre; clinical teaching staff, University of Toronto. Died Oct. 10, 2003, aged 87; survived by 2 children. "He took a very active part in the promotion of the Eye Bank in the early 1950s and 1960s at [several] Toronto hospitals, providing a steady flow of donated eyes for transplants and research."
