

Appendix 1: Histopathology of skin from the left breast of a 77-year-old women with lichen sclerosus two years after breast-conserving surgery and radiation therapy for breast cancer (T2N0M0). Visible are subepidermal edema (small black arrow), focal hyalinization (large black arrow) and scattered chronic inflammation (hematoxylin and eosin stain, \times 100 magnification). The overlying epidermis is flattened with loss of normal rete ridges (white arrow). These changes are in keeping with lichen sclerosus.
