Biographical details	<p>Sagar Dugani is an Internist based in Toronto. Sagar completed his BSc (2003), MSc (2005), and MD-PhD (2012) from the University of Toronto. Following that, he completed residency in Internal Medicine from Harvard Medical School/Brigham and Women’s Hospital (2015), and a fellowship in General Internal Medicine from the University of Toronto (2017). Sagar is dual certified to practice Internal Medicine in Canada (FRCPC) and the US (ABIM).</p> <p>Sagar has conducted research in the field of genetics, environmental chemistry, epilepsy, type II diabetes, stem cells, and is currently focused on the global burden of non-communicable diseases, with an emphasis on cardiovascular disease in the Middle East. He also serves as a Consultant to the World Bank, Washington DC. Sagar also co-founded IMAGINE, a student-run clinic for the delivery of holistic care to the homeless population in downtown Toronto. He has developed community programs for seniors, children, youth, and single mothers. Sagar served as an Associate Editor (2005-2007) and as a Chief Editor (2007-2008) of the University of Toronto Medical Journal (UTMJ). He also served as Chief co-Editor of Toronto Notes 2009, a publication used internationally for the LMCC examination; Chief co-Editor of a Pharmacology study aide (2011); and, Chief co-Editor of Clinical Anatomy Cases (2016). Furthermore, he serves as a Reviewer for several international journals. At the national level, as Chair of the CIM Trainee Committee on Clinician Investigator Trainee Association of Canada (CITAC-ACCFC), he led a committee that established a Trainee Section in the journal CIM (Clinical and Investigative Medicine; journal of the Canadian Society for Clinical Investigation). Nationally, Sagar served as VP-External and President of CITAC-ACCFC (Clinician Investigator Trainee Association of Canada).</p> <p>For his work on contributing to student life and the community at large, Sagar received CIHR and NSERC Scholarships for his PhD studies, the Mary L.
