Bertram, Lee I., Toronto; University of Western Ontario, 1948; DPH, ATCM; former assistant director, Medical Services Division, Department of Public Health, Toronto; lecturer, University of Toronto. Died Oct. 21, 2002, aged 79; survived by her husband, Dr. Mike, and daughters Dr. Susan and Dr. Leslie Rourke. Leslie Rourke commented: "She was a kind, caring physician, friend, wife, mother and grandmother."

Tyndel, Milo, Toronto; University of Vienna (Austria), 1933; psychiatry and neurology; FAPA, FACP, FRCPC; former research psychiatrist, Addiction Research Foundation; staff, Toronto General Hospital; head of psychiatric services, Workers' Compensation Board and Rehabilitation Centre, Toronto; associate professor, University of Toronto. Died Oct 2, 2002, aged 91; survived by his wife, Kristine, and a son, Dr. Felix Tyndel, who commented: "Medicine helped him to survive the Soviets and the Nazis, and to leave the aftermath of the Austro-Hungarian era for life on another continent."
