**Begg, Robert C.**, Saskatoon; University of Saskatchewan, 1971; orthopedic surgery; FRCSC; former staff, St. Paul's (Grey Nuns) Hospital; clinical lecturer, Royal University Hospital. Died Dec. 9, 2002, aged 54.
