**Bauman**, Leslie (Laszlo), North York, Ont.; Semmelweis Orvostudományi Egyetem, Hungary, 1951, diagnostic radiology. Died Feb. 24, 2007, aged 85.

**Bell**, Robert Hudspeth, Peterborough, Ont.; University of Toronto, 1941. Died Feb. 13, 2007, aged 92.

**Beroniade**, Vicentiu C., Montréal; Institutul de Medicina si Farmacie, Romania, 1954, internal medicine. Died Apr. 2, 2007, aged 77.

**Evans**, Ramon James, North York, Ont.; Welsh National School of Medicine, Wales, 1958, general surgery. Died Mar. 26, 2007, aged 75.

**Fairley**, John, Comox, BC; University of Cambridge, England, 1952. Died Mar. 27, 2007, aged 82.

**Fraser**, Robert Stewart, Edmonton; University of Alberta, 1946, internal medicine. Died Mar. 25, 2007, aged 85.

**Guzdziol**, Wladyslaw, Port Hawkesbury, NS; Akademia Medyczna, Poland, 1937. Died Mar. 16, 2007, aged 93.

**Kim**, Keith, Hamilton, Ont.; University of Manitoba, 1999. Died Apr. 1, 2007, aged 36. "Dr. Kim was born and raised in Winnipeg. He completed residency training at McMaster University. Keith is survived by his parents, Sung-Whan and Bong-Ja, and his sister, Kiok."

**Louridas**, George, Winnipeg; Univer-

sity of the Witwatersrand, South Africa, 1976. Died Apr. 2, 2007, aged 53. "Dr. Louridas was a dedicated physician and surgeon, an outstanding scientific mind, an award-winning professor, a deeply caring individual, a great friend, a very proud Greek and above all an attentive and loving husband, father and son. George dedicated his life to caring for everyone around him. He was well known as a world-class vascular surgeon who provided compassionate and skilled surgical care to his patients. He became head of vascular surgery at the University of Manitoba within 2 years of relocating to Canada from his native South Africa. George united the vascular community of Canada through the Winnipeg Vascular Symposium. He demonstrated his care for the greater community by initiating the Vascular Health Program, one of the first such programs in Canada. George leaves behind his loving wife of 30 years, Katy, and daughters, Georgia and Marisa."

**Morgan**, William Keith Campbell, Paris, Ont.; University of Sheffield, England, 1953, internal medicine. Died Mar. 23, 2007, aged 77. "A world renowned specialist in thoracic and pulmonary diseases, Dr. Morgan authored and contributed to over 50 textbooks and over 170 articles. He was chief of staff at the University Hospital (London, Ont.), head of the pulmonary diseases section and director of Chest Disease Services at the University of Western Ontario, president of the Maryland Thoracic Society, chair of the Environmental Health Committee of the American College of Chest Physicians, president of the Canadian Thoracic Society and a board member of the Scientific and Policy Advisors and American Council on Science and Health. He was the husband of the late Barbara and is survived by his 3 children and their spouses, Gwyn and Jayne, Rick and Stephanie, and Janet and Paul."

**Paproski**, Kenneth Robert, Edmon-

ton; University of Alberta, 1956. Died Jan. 25, 2007, aged 76.

**Resnik**, Irvine Charles, Regina; University of Pretoria, South Africa, 1971. Died Mar. 29, 2007, aged 63. "Dr. Resnik was respected and loved by a myriad of dear friends, colleagues and patients. He was born and educated in South Africa and worked in England before coming to Canada in 1976. He worked in Radville, Sask., before settling in Regina. Saskatchewan became Irvine's home and all of the people he cared so much for became his family."

**Shuster**, Samuel, Westmount, Que.; McGill University, 1936, internal medicine. Died Mar. 31, 2007, aged 96.

**White**, Hubert Carman, Kent Bridge, Ont.; University of Toronto, 1956, general surgery. Died Mar. 30, 2007, aged 74. "Dr. White opened his surgical practice in Chatham, Ont., in 1962 and remained active in it until February of this year. He was awarded the Glenn Sawyer Award in 1996. He volunteered with many organizations and served as a director for the Howard J. Rees Foundation. He is survived by his wife and 3 sons."

**Wright**, Gerald Adrian, Lethbridge, Alta.; University of Wales, 1938. Died Mar. 31, 2007, aged 89. "Dr. Wright served in the Royal Army Medical Corps during World War II in North Africa and Italy 1942-6. He immigrated to Canada in 1951 where he practised anesthesia and general medicine. Dr. Wright was a mountaineer and hiker, and he was included in the Canadian Centennial Alpine Club Expedition to St. Elias in the Yukon. He also climbed Mount Waddington and Mount Robson (highest in Coastal BC and the Canadian Rockies respectively) as well as peaks in Switzerland, Peru and New Zealand. Dr. Wright was invariably good-humoured and patient with others. An intellectual, he even attended opera in the month of his death."
